John Rous, who died in 1492, was a historian and a priest from Warwickshire. During Richard III's reign, John created the Rous Roll. This is a roll of parchment containing 65 pen drawings of the Earls of Warwick and other members of the Beauchamp family as well as Edward IV, Richard III and other important people from the town of Warwick. Under their pictures are their coats of arms and a brief explanation about them.

John was a tricky character though as he actually made 2 Rous Rolls - one in English and one in Latin. In the English roll, John describes Richard as a good man however, in the Latin roll, Richard is removed almost completely. Rumour has it that these changes were made after Richard's death, but why?
