Introduction

Housed in a former Victorian grammar school building, the Visitor Centre stands on the site of the medieval friary of the Grey Friars, where King Richard III was buried over 500 years ago after his defeat by Henry Tudor at the Battle of Bosworth.

The exhibition – Dynasty, Death and Discovery – gives visitors the chance to learn more about the king's life and reveals one of the greatest archaeological detective stories ever told, including the first ever genome sequencing of ancient DNA.

Visitors can also see the very place where King Richard III was hastily buried, now transformed and preserved under a glass floor.

The Centre is adjacent to Leicester Cathedral, where Richard III's remains were reinterred in March 2015.

Leicester Cathedral

Leicester Cathedral sits opposite the Visitor Centre. Set in the tranquil surroundings of Cathedral Gardens, the Cathedral is home to the final resting place of Richard III. Talks and tours

To enhance your visit why not choose one of our talks or tours for your group:

Group talks

The Wars of the Roses

This talk explores the conflict between the houses of York and Lancaster and the causes of the War of the Roses or - as it was more commonly known at the time - the Cousins War.

The King Under The Car Park

The focus of this talk is the "Looking for Richard" project, how Philippa Langley became involved in the Greyfriars dig of August 2012 and what the archaeologists found under the car park. Bone analysis, DNA and genealogy, injury analysis and carbon dating also feature in this fascinating talk, concluding with an insight to the re-burial of Richard, in March 2015.

The Princes In The Tower

Our new talk examines the events that led to the disappearance of the Two Princes; the main suspects, their motives and opportunity and what the likelihood was of any of them being responsible for the death of the princes. We also explore the other option, that one or more of the Princes escaped to live in secrecy.

All three talks last 30 minutes, with a Q&A session afterwards.

If you are a smaller group in search of a more structured visit, you can book one of our enthusiastic and knowledgeable guides. Your guide will highlight the key points of the story throughout our exhibition, and will have further interesting facts to add.

Booking terms and conditions

Admission

- Group bookings must be made in advance
- Prices are discounted concessionary rates and no further reductions are available
- A single payment is required to qualify for group rates
- Cancellations made with 24 hours or less notice will be charged 50% of their total visit cost
- Final details must be confirmed, and an update on numbers must be provided, one week before your visit
- Cheques must be made payable to Leicester City Council

Catering

- Orders, dietary requirements and final numbers must be confirmed 7 days in advance
- Payment will be for numbers confirmed 7 days in advance.
 Increases in group size can be accommodated (up to 55 people in total) and additional people will be charged for.
- Payment must be made in a single transaction

How to get here

By road:

The Visitor Centre is situated in Leicester city centre.

From the south: Leicester is located just off the M1; exit the M1 at Junction 21, signposted M69 and Leicester. Follow signs for the city centre.

From the North: Leicester is located just off the M1; exit the M1 at Junction 22 and join the A50. Follow signs for the city centre.

By train:

Leicester railway station is serviced by East Midlands Trains and CrossCountry with good rail links from major cities such as Birmingham, Sheffield and London. We are a 10 to 15-minute walk from Leicester railway station.

Visitor information

Coach drop off

We recommend using Southgates (postcode for adjacent building is LE1 5NS) as your coach drop-off point, Southgates is no more than a five-minute walk away from the Visitor Centre and is just off the inner ring road (A594).

We will arrange for one of our Customer Services team to meet your group on arrival.

Parking

Limited on-street parking for coaches is available in the city centre and we can book those spaces in advance for you. Please ask when making your booking with us.

If your group is arriving in individual cars, our nearest car park is St Nicholas Circle, which is a five-minute walk away. Alternatively, Highcross is approximately 10 minutes away. The nearest parking spaces for blue badge holders is on Applegate, which is a five-minute walk from the Visitor Centre.

A manual wheelchair is available to hire, free of charge and can be reserved in advance. The building is fully accessible throughout with a lift to get to the first floor. Disabled toilets are situated on the ground floor. Several enhancements have been implemented to improve access for visitors with hearing or visual impairments. Guests are able to bring carers to assist. Assistance dogs are welcome.
